Strategic Plan & National Service Delivery Model

Ghilaine Roquet VP Strategy & Planning

Strategic Plan 2022-25

- October December 2021: Prioritization and ranking of the Strategic Initiatives with our Researcher Council
- October 2021 January 2022: Operational data collection and planning is underway to develop a combined roadmap to advance Canada's DRI strategy.
 - The roadmap will integrate the major initiatives outlined in the Strategic Plan with the infrastructure renewal needs identified by Regions and Host sites. These will be reflected in the Alliance's Corporate plan for 2022-2023.
- December 2021: Our public facing Strategic Plan document has been submitted for approval by our Board of Directors and then will be published and circulated.

Operational & Strategic Planning

- RDM: Collaborative work is underway between the Alliance RDM Team and the Strategic Initiatives team to ensure alignment between current operations and strategic initiatives.
- ARC: Information sharing has started between the Council of CTO's and the Strategic Initiatives team ensure alignment between current operations and strategic initiatives. Additional engagement with the National Team Leads will be scheduled in the coming months.
- RS: Analysis has started to capture current operational support for RS to align with the DRI Strategy and a RS Service Working Group will be formed in 2022.

National Service Delivery Model

The National Service Delivery Model outlines a collection of activities, processes, roles & responsibilities and methodologies focused on how we will develop, design and deliver DRI Services while maintaining a researcher-centric approach.

We will have a proposal for ISED on implementation by April 30, 2022.

In collaboration with the Federation preliminary work has started to:

- define and develop a criteria for National, Regional & Local service delivery
- create an evidence-based framework to identify eligible costs for match across ARC, RDM and RS Services within Canada

Budget 2022-23

- Multiple iterations over the summer to try to establish new funding model based upon National, Regional, Local services
- None worked. October 7 face to face gathering of ISED, Alliance, Host Sites reps, CCF CEOs to break the log jam
- It was agreed by all that FY'23 would be a transition year vs. trying to force the future state without enough information
- Decided to use CFI eligibility and match criteria
- \$35M funding proposal developed for submission to ISED with the goal of not impacting current staffing or service levels.
- ISED feedback expected in January 2022

Transition Plan


- Our plan for April 1, 2022 is to transition everything as it is, as much as possible.

- The current 35 national teams will remain in place.

Transition Activities

- Existing Compute Canada Federation committees will remain.
- Job Offers have been provided to CCNO staff who support services being transitioned (e.g., CCDB and MIT teams).
- Alliance is fully participating with the current 2022 Resource Allocation Competitions (RAC) process and initiating prep for RAC 2023.
- Alliance is actively engaged in the CFI Awards Grants Administration process.
